### **Litigation Strategies for the Construction Law Practitioner** *Andrew Ness*

As gleaned from over 30 years of construction litigation experience, Mr. Ness will share his strategies for litigating the complex construction case including pretrial preparation strategies and dealing with expert testimony.

*Andrew D. Ness is a partner with the Washington D.C. firm of Howrey, LLP. He received a BSEE degree from Stanford University and a JD from Harvard Law School. Mr. Ness has assisted owners and contractors with respect to solving complex construction and design related problems and has litigated large construction disputes throughout the United States.*

### **Steel Structure Collapse of the Chicago Post Office Building: Forensic Investigation and Jury Trial** *Ian Chin*

Mr. Chin will present the results of his forensic investigation following the structural steel collapse of a Chicago post office building while under construction. Because the case ultimately went to trial, Mr. Chin will share his trial preparation and presentation strategies from the perspective of testifying expert.

*Ian Chin is Vice President and Senior Principal for Chicago engineering consulting firm Wiss, Janney, Elstner Associates, Inc. He received a Bachelor of Architecture and a Master's degree in structural engineering from the University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign. Since joining WJE in 1978, Mr. Chin has performed hundreds of investigations of distress conditions in buildings and other structures and often testifies as an expert witness pertaining to structural failures.*

### **Construction Litigation Strategies - Mock Construction Trial** *Chancellor Ellen Hobbs Lyle, Tim Gibbons, Todd Panther, Gary Parkes, David Wright*

This session will focus on litigation strategies to employ in presenting the construction case at trial. Participants will conduct a mock trial of a construction defect case which will include opening statements, fact witness examinations and expert witness examinations. Davidson County Chancellor Ellen Hobbs Lyle will preside over the mock trial and offer her "view from the bench" with regard to the effective presentation of a construction dispute at trial.
